No need to panic: the Lexus UXh hybrid self-charging SUV consumes barely 6L/100 km on the highway and one fill-up will take you far, requiring fewer stops along the way. As for following a scenic driver: Dynamic Radar Cruise Control can make the necessary speed adjustment automatically, for an easier long drive.
